Tony was born and raised here in Wenatchee, and after his time in the service, he has continued to serve, first as Vet Corps Navigator while attending WVC for Music, then Vet Corps Regional Coordinator while completing his Bachelor's in Interdisciplinary Studies from Central Washington. He accepted the role as County Veteran Service Officer in early 2016, and has been helping thousands of area veterans with disability claims, resource referrals, and more.

Eric Fritts served in the US Army 1985-1997 first as a Mechanic, then moving into a position training and preparing troops for deployment. He developed a computer program to guide Administration NCOs through the mobilization preparedness process and evaluation reporting. Shortly after separation, he quickly moved into a career as a corporate trainer and standards manager.

Having been raised in Okanogan, it seemed fitting for Eric to return home and serve his community by using his previous experience to build a program for Veteran Service Officers and the VA Claims process, which has become a model program in WA, while also serving as the **Veterans Service Officer for Okanogan County**. For his development, Eric was awarded the Distinguished Service Award from Washington State Department of Veterans Affairs for outstanding service to Veterans in 2018.

Sarah Simonson served in the Air Force 1999 – 2004 as a Security Forces journeyman at the Air Force Academy with a deployment to Saudi Arabia in support of Operation Southern Watch.

Sarah and family moved to Wenatchee to be closer to some good friends in 2009. Since then, the Wenatchee Valley has become home. She has spent 13 years being a stay-at-home mom. WorkSource is a statewide partnership of state, local and nonprofit agencies that provides an array of employment and training services to job seekers and employers in Washington.

Federal law entitles veterans and eligible spouses priority access to WorkSource services. This includes priority referrals to jobs that are listed with WorkSource, as well as other employment and training programs.

If you were discharged after 9/11/01, you can sign up for intensive one-on-one employment support through the federal Gold Card program to help with your job hunt.

In addition to individualized job hunt support, local WorkSource offices host a variety of free classes and workshops on a regular basis, including Resume Writing, Job Search Strategies, Office Computer Basics, and Interview Practice Sessions.
