County Veterans Advisory Boards

In accordance with WA RCW 73.08.035, each county in Washington state must establish a veterans' advisory board, which shall advise the county legislative authority on the needs of local veterans, and the resources and programs available to benefit local veterans, and their families, in need. These advisory board meetings are open to the public.

Okanogan County VAB meets on the **first Tuesday of every 3rd month at 1pm** at the US Armed Forces Legacy Building (Tonasket). Next meeting is **02 March 2021**.

<u>Grant County VAB</u> meets on the **second Wednesday of every 3rd month at 4pm** in the Commissioners Hearing Room of the Grant County courthouse (35 C St NW, Ephrata). Next meeting is **10 March 2021**.

<u>Chelan County VAB</u> meets on the **third Thursday of every other month at 1:30pm** at the Chelan County Commissioners Building (400 Douglas St, Wenatchee). Next meeting is in Feb.

<u>Douglas County VAB</u> meets **monthly on the first Friday at 10:30am** at VFW Post 3617 (211 11th St NE, East Wenatchee). Next meeting is TBD.
