# Airborne Hazards & Burn Pit Exposure

As of August 2, the VA is now processing disability claims for asthma, rhinitis and sinusitis on a presumptive basis based on presumes particulate matter exposures during military service in Southwest Asia and certain other areas (including Iraq and Afghanistan, the Gulfs of Aden and Oman, the Persian Gulf, Arabian Sea, Red Sea, and airspace above these locations).

This is the first step in ensuring service members who were exposed to the Burn Pits are cared for in a manner that covers various chronic symptoms related to such exposure.

On August 21st, 2021 we held a Cadet Milestone Reception to honor cadets who had recently passed milestone exams and requirements. Held at the American Legion Hall in Wenatchee, Lt Col Tom Green (C.A.P.), Col, Ret, ANG/Army Reserves, presented the awards. Col Green was a C.A.P. cadet in the Wenatchee squadron in 1957.

The Wright Brothers Award, the first milestone of the cadet program, was awarded to Jacob Tate of East Wenatchee, Grey Olin of Entiat, and Zachary Wiser of Leaveworth. This award required the cadets to pass exams in leadership, drill, and physical fitness, and includes promotion to Cadet Staff Sergeant.

The General Billy Mitchell Award, the second milestone of the cadet program, was awarded to Elijah Riinke of Wenatchee. This award required a comprehensive exam of all leadership and aerospace education chapters in the first two phases of the cadet program and earned a promotion to cadet officer as a Second Lieutenant.

Captain Audra Keyanna, C.A.P earned the Senior Member of the Year award for her service in the cadet program during the COVID-19 pandemic, while the program was meeting virtually.
