### MISSION act

The MISSION (Maintaining Internal Systems and Strengthening Integrated Outside Networks) Act strengthens the VA's ability to deliver trusted, easy to access, high quality care at VA facilities, virtually through telehealth, and in your community. That means you get the care and services you need, where and when you need them. You can learn more about the MISSION Act, and what it means for you and your healthcare, at https://missionact.va.gov



The MISSION Act when into effect June 6<sup>th</sup> 2019, and with it brings new benefits such as Urgent Care. Urgent Care is a type of walk-in health care for situations where you need help but don't have an emergency, such as colds, ear infections, minor injuries, skin infections, and strep throat.

This means, in most cases, you can take these medical concerns to a local walk-in clinic without prior approval, and the VA will cover some or all of the costs.

WDVA encourages us to start filing Agent Orange Presumptive Claims for any Blue Water Navy Vietnam Veterans who were within 12 miles of the coast of Vietnam.

## Civil Air Patrol

The **Pangborn Composite Squadron** is part of the Civil Air Patrol, handled by Senior members of the United States Air Force Auxiliary. This squadron was first formed in January of 1942, approximately 77 years ago here in the Wenatchee Valley, part of the U.S. Army Air Corps. They performed tasks such as supply airlifts, VIP transports, sea rescues, and hunting submarines off the Eastern coast line. Today we are over 63,000 strong and located in all 50 states, including two (2) U.S. Territories. At the end of WWII, the Civil Air Patrol became part of the now U.S Air Force and took on three (3) new primary missions: **Aerospace Education**, the **Cadet Program**, and **Emergency Search & Rescue**.

Open to students aged 12 - 18, our meetings are at the National Guard Armory in Wenatchee, Tuesdays, 6 - 8:45pm

Cadet Program: Local units or "Squadrons" come together for activities including aircraft orientation flights, model airplane & rocketry building, color guard teams, physical fitness, and character development. Aerospace Education: To promote an understanding & appreciation of aviation & space exploration, the Cadets learn Science, technology, engineering, and math through special science projects and national Cyber patriot security programs. Emergency Search & Rescue: Save lives and relieve human suffering, including SAR ops & assisting with disaster relief operations.

## **Burn Pit Registry**

The VA's Airborne Hazards & Open Burn Pit Registry is a database of information about OEF/OIF/OND/OFS Veterans/Servicemembers who have deployed to the Southwest Asia theater of operations on or after August 2, 1990 or to Afghanistan or Djibouti after September 11, 2001. Eligible Veterans/Servicemembers can use the registry questionnaire to report exposures to airborne hazards (such as smoke from burn pits, oil-well fires, or pollution during deployment), as well as other exposures and health concerns. This data will be used to improve VA Programs and services for these types of Veterans.
