It's been almost a year since I started this little newsletter project, in an attempt to bring more traffic to my humble website. It's turned out to be more needed and appreciated than I ever expected. I've made more connections, shared more information, and started to unite our community across the miles.

Thank you to everyone who has supported me in whatever way along this journey. I couldn't have made it this far without your help. But in order to be worthy of receiving your continued support, I owe you some transparency.

As I'm sure you can guess, this whole project costs money. Being a freelancer and entrepreneur in my "day job", I really don't have any more of my own money to spare. So how much does it take to make this happen?

Website domain registration & hosting: \$110 annually

Website resource directory with map integration: <u>\$70</u> annually

Newsletter printing & distribution: <u>\$250 per issue</u> (x6 issues annually)

That means it takes <u>\$1,680 per year</u> to keep this project going. And aside from Sponsorship slots, there's no other income. **NOTE: I will never charge my readers** to receive this information. This is why your donations are so important.

When I have about \$194 to spare, I plan to add 2 additional features to the donations page: the option for donors to pay transaction fees, and the ability to make your donation automatic every month.
